Guidelines for the Establishment of Scholarships for Outstanding Students

Article 1 National Taiwan University (hereinafter “NTU” or the “University”) established these regulations to provide the Scholarship for Outstanding Student Performance (hereinafter "the Scholarship"), to reward students of the University who have demonstrated outstanding excellence during their studies and brought honor to the University.

Article 2 The award amounts for the Scholarship are as follows :

1. the maximum amount of the scholarship is NT\$50,000 per applicant.
2. For students applying as a group, the maximum amount of the scholarship is NT\$200,000 per group.

Applicants who receive both a team and an individual award for the Scholarship will be limited to the award amount of the individual award

Article 3 The maximum number of recipients for this Scholarship per academic year : 15.

Article 4 Currently enrolled undergraduate, master's, and doctoral students of the University who have demonstrated outstanding performance in the following categories during their time at the University, and have been recommended by relevant

administrative units or departments/institutes of the University, may apply for this Scholarship. Each person is limited to applying for one category:

1. Competition Category: Students who have represented Republic of China (R.O.C.) or NTU in inter-school or international competitions, achieved excellent results, and brought honor to the University.
2. Academic Category: Various creations, inventions, design patents, or research achievements that have made significant contributions to society and enhanced the reputation of the University.
3. Other Categories: Performances outside of the Competition and Academic categories that have made significant contributions to society and can serve as a role model for students of the University.

Students who participate in competitions or academic research as a team should apply for this Scholarship under the team's name.

Students applying for this Scholarship as a team must list all team members' information and individual contributions in the application form and obtain written consent from all team members.

For academic category applications, if there are co-authors, the applicant student must be the first author or corresponding author and apply for this Scholarship as an individual.

Article 5 The Student Assistance Division of the Office of Student Affairs makes annual announcement of this scholarship during the first semester of each academic year. Interested applicants may submit their applications with the following documents to the

Student Assistance Division by the posted application deadline:

1. Application Form.
2. Recommendation Form.
3. Relevant supporting documents (including but not limited to theses/dissertations, competition certificates, awards, consent forms from all team members for group applications, etc.).

After Student Assistance Division of the Office compiles the aforementioned application materials and conducts a preliminary review, academic category applications will be forwarded to the Office of Research and Development, competition category applications related to sports will be forwarded to the Department of Athletics, and other applications will be forwarded to relevant colleges or administrative units for secondary review and recommendations. The Scholarship Committee will then conduct the final review.

Article 6 The Scholarship Committee shall be composed of the Dean of Student Affairs and one faculty member nominated by each college of the University, with the Dean of Student Affairs serving as the convener.

The Scholarship Committee is responsible for reviewing Scholarship applications, deciding the list of awardees, and determining award amounts.

Article 7 The list of scholarship recipients will be announced after being approved by the Dean of Student Affairs., and the awardees will receive public recognition from the University.

Article 8 These regulations shall take effect from the date of promulgation after being approved by the Administrative Council Meeting..
