# Directives Governing the Establishment of Scholarships for Outstanding Students

### Article 1 Purpose:

National Taiwan University (NTU or "the University") formulates the NTU *Directives Governing the Establishment of Scholarships for Outstanding Students* to reward students who have achieved distinguished or outstanding performance that can win honors for the University while enrolled at the University.

# Article 2 Scholarship amounts:

For students applying as individuals, the maximum scholarship amount is NT\$50,000 per applicant. For students applying as a group, the maximum scholarship amount is NT\$200,000 per group. A successful applicant who has been awarded both an individual scholarship and a group scholarship shall receive the monetary amount of the individual scholarship only.

#### Article 3 Number of scholarships available: 15

#### Article 4 Eligibility:

Undergraduate and graduate students (in both Master's and Ph.D. programs) currently enrolled at NTU who achieve outstanding performance in the following areas and have been recommended by the unit concerned or their academic program may apply for the scholarship:

- 1. Multi-category: Students who have achieved distinguished performance in at least two separate categories (such as a competition and an academic discipline) while enrolled at the University.
- 2. Competitions: Students who have achieved outstanding results representing NTU in an intercollegiate or international competition and won honors for the University.
- 3. Academic achievement: Students who have made substantial contributions to society through creative works, inventions, patents, or research results, and thus helped bolster the University's academic reputation.

Any student who applies for a scholarship shall submit a group application if he or she has participated as a member of a competition or research team that forms the basis of the application.

Group applications shall contain information regarding all participating members and their individual contributions. The written consent of all members must be obtained before a group application may be submitted.

For an application based on academic achievement, it is not necessary to apply as a team if the application is based on a work authored by one or more co-authors.

- Article 5 The Student Assistance Division of the Office of Student Affairs shall make an annual announcement of this scholarship during the first semester of each academic year. Interested applicants may submit their applications with the following documents to the Student Assistance Division by the posted application deadline:
  - 1. Application form
  - 2. Recommendation form
  - 3. Relevant supporting documents
- Article 6 Application review procedures:

The Vice President for Student Affairs shall convene a Review Committee consisting of one faculty member appointed by each college to evaluate the applications and determine a list of successful applicants.

- Article 7 The list of scholarship recipients shall be announced upon approval by the Vice President for Student Affairs, and the awardees will receive public recognition from the University.
- Article 8 The Directives shall be passed by the Administrative Meeting and then implemented on the date of promulgation.
